Let us use words in speech and writing that lift up and exhort those around us; they will bring more smiles and joy to our hearts, then those that tear down.

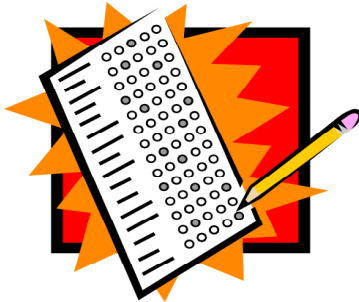

Have you heard Legacy has a Dance Team? Did you know that they compete locally? Or how about that they placed 3rd in a recent competition? Way to go Lions!

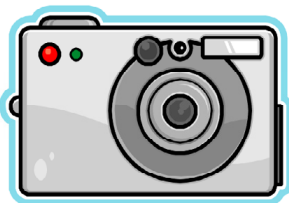
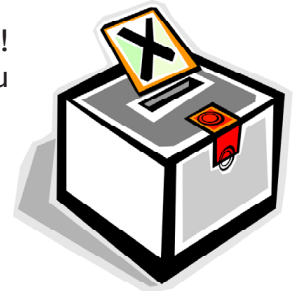


IMPORTANT Info . . .
