Unfortunately, this negative attitude is even heard on the Legacy Christian School campus primarily in words like, "why does he get that and I don't," or my most favorite phrase uttered by children of all ages, "it's not fair!"

These remarks are driven by the concept of "equality." Not the equality of opportunity, but the equality of results. This means that it can only be equal, when the same results are achieved. What a flawed mentality!

In 1 Corinthians 12, we are reminded that God has blessed us all differently and that we are to use these blessed differences to support one another. The Apostle Paul describes this relationship using an analogy of the human body. Separate parts with separate functions working as one to reach a common goal. Our equality comes in Christ, not in worldly possessions, talents and abilities, or results.

So, what are LCS Knights-in-training to draw from this? To do their very best on every task set before them! To not gloat over their ability or ridicule another's weakness. To graciously help their classmates when given the opportunity and to protect one another from harm.

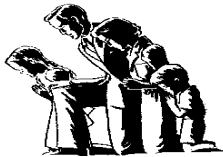
ACADEMIC CALENDAR CHANGE 2011-2012
